



What is Reincarnation?

Reincarnation believes that after death people return to earth again in another human body (cf. Latin carne, "flesh")




Among Native Americans

Pantheism (Greek pan, "all" + theism, "God") is the worldview of reincarnation in which God is an mpersonal force; the universe is God and God is the universe.



Shirley MacLaine's 1987 book influenced the USA towards reincarnation



The Bible never mentions reincarnation into many bodies

A Philosophical Response

- 1. Reincarnation encourages murder
- 2. Reincarnation claims all comes from choice
- 3. Reincarnation requires every experience
- 4. Reincarnation is fatalistic
- 5. Reincarnation discourages care for others
- 6. Reincarnationists cannot live consistently
- 7. Reincarnation makes us immoral
- 8. Reincarnation blames God for all evil
- 9. Reincarnation believes that evil is eternal

Conclusion

Reincarnation provides no real hope for conquering evil in our world or us. It is a philosophy that even reincarnationists do not believe. They intuitively know that right and wrong exist, so they do not live consistent with the teaching that everything is legitimate. Instead of helping defeat evil in the world, reincarnation provides justification for more of it.



¹⁸ For Christ also died for sins once for all, *the* just for *the* unjust, so that He might bring us to God, having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit;



²⁰ who once were disobedient, when the patience of God kept waiting in the days of Noah, during the construction of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through *the* water.

Jesus #3

Spirits of those who perished in flood in Noah's time

Between death and resurrection

To proclaim gospel to the dead and offering a second chance to repent.

No Second Chance

¹⁸ For Christ also died for sins once for all, *the* just for *the* unjust, so that He might bring us to God, having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit;

- ¹⁹ in which also He went and made proclamation to the spirits *now* in prison,
- ²⁰ who once were disobedient, when the patience of God kept waiting in the days of Noah, during the construction of the ark,
 - 1. The text nowhere states that any second chance to believe is provided for the recipients of the message.
 - 2. Hebrews 9:27 notes that judgment (not opportunity to believe) follows the death of each person. It says, "man is destined to die once, and after that to face judgment."

1 Peter 3:19-22 (NASB)

¹⁹in which also He went and made proclamation to the spirits *now* in prison, ²⁰who once were disobedient, when the patience of God kept waiting in the days of Noah, during the construction of the ark,

²¹Corresponding to that, baptism now saves you—not the removal of dirt from the flesh, but an appeal to God for a good conscience—through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²²who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him.

Peter is describing Christ's triumph over death, His resurrection and ascension.

He writes about Christ preaching to spirits in prison.

The main idea of the text is Christ's suffering resulted in victory over death and salvation for us. Verses 19-20 are central to this whole idea of righteous

Christ's Body v. Spirit

having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit; in which also He went and made proclamation to the spirits *now* in prison,

The body died but the spirit continued to live?

The body died and was resurrected?

1 Corinthians 15:44-45 ⁴⁴ it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body. ⁴⁵ So also it is written, "The first MAN, Adam, BECAME A LIVING SOUL." The last Adam became a life-giving spirit.

Therefore, it is most likely that Christ died, was resurrected and then preached his victory over death to these demons imprisoned since Noah's day.

2 Peter 2:5

Angels after sinning were cast into pits of darkness, reserved for judgment.

Jude 1:6

Some angels are in eternal bonds in darkness for the judgment of the great day

1 Enoch 21:1-2

This place is the prison of the angels, and they will be imprisoned here forever.

Jesus, after resurrection, went to proclaim judgment on the angelic spirits held in prison.

Spiritualizing

In Noah's days, only humans could escape judgment, not fallen angels. There is no reason for God to wait patiently for angels.

In 1 Enoch the disobedient angels sinned not in Noah's day but in the days of Jared.

1 Peter 1:10-11

Prophets discern with the Spirit of Christ within them.

2 Peter 2:5 shows Noah is a preacher of righteousness

Peter uses the ark to mean certain death for those who did not believe. Noah as a type shows the salvation that is now in Christ.

The Transfer of Paradise

Eph. 4:8-10

...today you will be

"That is why the Scriptures say, 'When he ascended to the heights, he led a crowd of captives and gave gifts to his people.' 9Notice that it says 'he ascended.' This clearly means that Christ also descended to our lowly world. ¹⁰And the same one who descended is the one who ascended higher than all the heavens, so that he might fill the entire universe with himself."

¹⁹So he went and preached to the spirits in prison—²⁰those who disobeyed God long ago when God waited patiently while Noah was building his boat. Only eight people were saved from drowning in that terrible flood."

"...there is a great chasm separating us. No one can cross over to you from here, and no one can cross over to us from there."

"Then death and [Hades] were thrown into the lake of fire... 15And anyone whose name was not found recorded in the Book of Life was thrown into the lake of fire."


