




Israel's incomplete occupation of Canaan led to the need for judges (1:1–2:5).









Judges tried to stop Israel's cycles of sin to show that God's absolute standards were better than Israel's relative standards (2:6–16:31).

"One day when Samson was in Timnah, one of the Philistine women caught his eye. ²When he returned home, he told his father and mother, 'A young Philistine woman in Timnah caught my eye. I want to marry her. Get her for me'' (Judges 14:1-2 NLT).



"As Samson and his parents were going down to Timnah, a young lion suddenly attacked Samson near the vineyards of Timnah. ⁶At that moment the Spirit of the LORD came powerfully upon him, and he ripped the lion's jaws apart with his bare hands. He did it as easily as if it were a young goat. But he didn't tell his father or mother about it"






"Samson said, 'This time I cannot be blamed for everything I am going to do to you Philistines.' ⁴Then he went out and caught 300 foxes. He tied their tails together in pairs, and he fastened a torch to each pair of tails. ⁵Then he lit the torches and let the foxes run through the grain fields of the Philistines. He burned all their grain to the ground, including the sheaves and the uncut grain. He also destroyed their vineyards and olive groves" (Judges 15:3-5 NLT).














Samson's Haircut










Israel's religious and moral failures showed they needed a righteous king instead of their relativism (Judges 17–21).





Moral Failure (19–21)

Benjamites in Gibeah rape and kill a Levite's concubine (19)

- 400,000 warriors of other 11 tribes destroy 26,100 Benjamites, including women and children (20).

- Benjamites kill everyone in Jabesh Gilead except 400 virgins and steal another 200 virgins at Shiloh as wives for the remaining 600 Benjamites to preserve their line.

The Last Verse is the Key Verse










Discussion Question: How is Our Day Like the Judges Period?

- <u>Secularism</u>: "I don't let my religion affect my politics"
- Promiscuity: "What that leader does in his bedroom is his business and not mine"





Applications


- Rejecting God's lordship (incomplete obedience) plants the seeds for failure (1–2).
- Personal relative standards instead of God's absolute standards lead to cycles of sin (3–16).
- Replacing God's wisdom with personal whims leads to idolatry (17–21).


