
A Rough Start as Judge




Route of the Ark (1 Samuel 5)



David's Courage






Who was David?

Youngest son of Jesse

- Handsome, strong, courageous
- Shepherd tending his father's sheep
- Strong arms, excellent harpist



Chosen by the LORD
Anointed as Israel's 2nd king
Spirit of God came upon Him with power



Bethlehem: David was anointed king by Samuel here (1 Sam 16:13,15)



Bethlehem plays a much larger role in ther New Testament as the birthplace of Jesus


David Over Goliath





 - What did the LORD say?




Saul died with his sons Jonathan, Abinadab, and Malkishua (1 Sam. 31:2)

The better way to change is for us to let God lead us






