The musicians were organized into instrumentalists and singers to offer praise to the LORD in the ministry of prophesying (1 Chron 25).
The temple officers were organized into gatekeepers, treasurers, and administrators for smooth functioning of the temple (1 Chron 26).

"Then David gave Solomon the plans for the Temple and its surroundings, including the entry room, the storerooms, the upstairs rooms, the inner rooms, and the inner sanctuary—which was the place of atonement. <sup>12</sup>David also gave Solomon all the plans he had in mind for the courtyards of the Lord's Temple, the outside rooms, the treasuries, and the rooms for the gifts dedicated to the LORD" (28:11-12)



David commissioned Israel and Solomon to follow God's design for the temple building and service by Levites and priests (1 Chron 28).

It was nearly time for the Jewish Passover elebration, so Jesus went to Jerusalem.

#### In the Temple area he saw merchants selling cattle, sheep, and doves for sacrifices.

#### He also saw dealers at tables exchanging foreign money.



#### Jesus made a whip from some ropes and chased them all out of the Temple.

He drove out the sheep and cattle, scattered the money changers' coins over the floor

#### and turned over their tables.

#### Then, going over to the people who sold doves, he told them...

#### "Get these things out of here. Stop turning my Father's house into a marketplace!"

Then his disciples remembered this prophecy from the Scriptures: "Passion for God's house will consume me."



But the Jewish leaders demanded, "What are you doing? If God gave you authority to do this, show us a miraculous sign to prove it." "All right," Jesus replied. "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up."

"What!" they exclaimed. "It has taken forty-six years to build this **Temple, and you** can rebuild it in three days?"
