How does God restore us?

(3 ways in Neh 2)

God informs us of our sad state of affairs (2:11-15).



"I went to Jerusalem, and after staying there three days ¹²I set out during the night with a few men. I had not told anyone what my God had put in my heart to do for Jerusalem. There were no mounts with me except the one I was riding on" (2:11-12 NIV).

"By night I went out through the Valley Gate toward the **Jackal Well and** the Dung Gate, examining the walls of Jerusalem, which had been broken down, and its gates, which had been destroyed by fire" (2:13 NIV).

They dedicated it and set up its doors, building the wall as far as the Tower of the Hundred, which they dedicated, and the **Tower of Hananel.** ²People from the town of Jericho worked next to them, and beyond them was Zaccur son of Imri.

- We can focus too much on Nehemiah as a construction manager.
- But he was also a man of prayer.
- In Nehemiah 5 we also see that he responds to the cry of the poor.
- Do we?

Prayer



Compassion

1. Nehemiah helped the poor by fighting greed in others and in his own life (5:1-19).

A. The problem: A famine enabled wealthy Jews to take advantage of poorer Jews (5:1-5).

B. The solution: Nehemiah fought greed with both public rebuke and personal example (5:6-19).

2. Help the poor by fighting greed.



Be generous yourself.

Nehemiah's Example

- Nehemiah used personal resources instead of demanding more from the people.
- The cries of the poor impacted the way he did his job and how he leveraged the roles and resources that God had given him.
- He understood that God cares for the poor and called him (and calls us) to respond with compassion and action.
