Hebel literally means "a breath, wind, or vapor" (Prov. 21:6; Isa. 57:13).

### **Ecclesiastes**

### Metaphor: what doesn't last -"what is without real substance, value, permanence, significance, or meaning" (BKC, 1:976)

### **A Very Literal Translation**

### What's wind or vapor like?

 fleeting or transitory (6:12 with 3:19; 7:15; 9:9; 11:10)

enigmatic or perplexing (6:2; 8:10, 14)

unseen and obscure (11:8).



### Synonyms:

Fleeting Passing **Brief** Temporary Momentary Transitory **Short-lived** 

## Life's many cycles are passing (1:3-11).

### "What do people get for all their hard work under the sun?" (NLT)



Theme (of 1:1–6:9): Our work ultimately brings us nowhere (1:3).

### Proof: Life's many fleeting repetitions bring no real change (1:4-11).

"So I became greater than all who had lived in Jerusalem before me, and my wisdom never failed me."

"Anything I wanted, I would take. I denied myself no pleasure. I even found great pleasure in hard work, a reward for all my labors. <sup>11</sup> But as I looked at everything I had worked so hard to accomplish, it was all so meaninglesslike chasing the wind. There was nothing really worthwhile anywhere."

### Wisdom is Practical

"Biblical wisdom includes the art of being skillful and successful in one's relationships and responsibilities in life... An individual is 'successful' as he directs his life in accord with God's divine design, His plans for the world."

Roy B. Zuck, A Biblical Theology of the OT, 213



Wha. are the qualities of wisdom?

### 1. Wisdom is balanced: Avoid the extremes of depending on righteousness and living in sin (7:15-18).

### 2. Wisdom is strong: Avoid the weakness from blindness to your own faults (7:19-22).



#### 3. Wisdom is insightful: Avoid thinking you have all the answers but still show insight (7:23-29).



#### Main Idea

Wisdom is balanced, strong, and insightful.
#### **Balance:** Is wisdom guarding me from extremes? Strength: Is wisdom keeping me stable? Insight: Is wisdom clearing my mind to see reality?

#### 2. We punish the wrong people —so it puzzles us (8:10-14).



#### Who do we punish?

We don't punish bad people (8:10-13).

We punish good people instead (8:14).

#### 3. Enjoy life and submit to God even though He won't tell us His reasons (8:15-17).



"So I recommend having fun, because there is nothing better for people in this world than to eat, drink, and enjoy life."

**"That way they** will experience some happiness along with all the hard work God gives them under the sun" (8:15 NLT).

**"Don't let the** excitement of youth cause you to forget your Creator. Honor him in your youth before you grow old and say, 'Life is not pleasant anymore" (12:1 NLT).

#### Faith is a decision

#### The Theme: Life is fleeting (12:8).

#### "Everything is meaningless," says the Teacher, "completely meaningless."

#### **Key Word of Ecclesiastes**

## 2. The Authority: Live by God's words (12:9-12).

#### God's words matter!

"<sup>9</sup>Not only was the Teacher wise, but also he imparted knowledge to the people. He pondered and searched out and set in order many proverbs. <sup>10</sup>The Teacher searched to find just the right words, and what he wrote was upright and true" (Eccl. 12:9-10 NIV).



#### The Bible's Wisdom

"<sup>11</sup>The words of the wise are like goads, their collected sayings like firmly embedded nails—given by one Shepherd. <sup>12</sup>Be warned, my son, of anything in addition to them." (Eccl. 12:11-12a NIV).

"Of making many books there is no end...." (Eccl. 12:12b NIV)

#### "...and much study wears you out" (12:12c NLT).

3. The Conclusion: Respect and obey God because this applies to everyone (12:13-14).



#### "That's the whole story. Here now is my final conclusion: Fear God and obey his commands" (12:13a-b NLT).

### But why?

"That's the whole story. Here now is my final conclusion: Fear God and obey his commands, for this is everyone's duty" (12:13 NLT).



#### Said differently...

#### Respect and obey God to finish well.
