It embodies... a determined effort to enforce a standard of conduct upon others, which conduct the enforcer knowingly and deliberately refuses to apply to himself hence, action born of full knowledge and evil intent."

#### **Chronology of Ezra-Nehemiah**









HOSEA was chosen by God to be an assangle to the people of target. His wife was writatthful, but just like God he never stopped toving her and always tooked for her whenever she left him. **JOB** prophesied during a time when the land of Israel had suffered from a great plague of locust. Joel proclaims this as a sign from God as a precursor to the Day of the Locil.

ATTODS was a sheep breeder and a tender of fig trees by trade, but God used him to him to bring a powerful word of correction to Israel and the surrounding nations. Obadiah is the chortest book in the old testament with only 21 verses. The book is a proclamation of judgment against Edom for adding the Baby Idmians in their slege against Jerussiem.

Jonah is the most famous of the minor prophets because a glant was animal was used to set him back on course after going actray. His mission was to tell the people of Nineven to repent of their wrongdoings.

Micah in 1.8 lasented without wearing clothes in order to illustrate the saverity of the destitution and captivity that was coming. This method was also used by liasiah at times (traiah 20:2-3).



Nahum predicts the destruction of Mineweh the great capital of the Assyrian empire. Evidently the reforms introduced by Jonah did not liast long.

2. Name (1:1; 3:1) could be a proper noun (Malachi) or a common noun (my messenger)



#### **B.** The Book

#### 1. Date/Occasion

during the Persian period
a century after Temple in 516 BC
postexilic prophets 100 years
earlier: Haggai & Zechariah

#### 2. Historical Context

- -- Period of tension
- -- No greatness of God's Kingdom after the temple
- -- No sign of God's presence and blessing
- -- People did not conform to God's expectations
- -- They were not zealous for the Lord
- -- They failed to tithe
- -- They divorced their wives
- -- They married foreign women
- -- They offered maimed and diseased animals
- -- The priests accepted these sacrifices for God

#### 3. Purpose

 To restore the people to a right relationship with God (Van Gemeren)

 To rebuke Israel's sin to exhort the people to leave their sinful lifestyle in exchange for blessing in the Kingdom (Griffith)

 To rekindle the faith of a discouraged people and set forth the continuing demands of the covenant upon those who truly know God (Leggett)

### Audience

- <u>Time</u>: third or fourth generation Jews after the return from exile 100 years earlier
- <u>Their Expectations</u>: fulfillment of the glory of the new temple under Messiah in the kingdom
- <u>Reality</u>: disillusioned, discouraged, and doubting people experiencing poverty and drought

#### 5. Fourth Disputation (2:17–3:5): Dispute about God's Justice

- You have wearied me.
- How have we wearied you?
- By not only trying to make evil good, but by implying that I delight in evil because I do not dispense immediate justice.
- Oracle against the people of Judah re: unfaithfulness to the covenant: they are unrighteous and unjust; the Day of the Lord will judge all evildoers and them.

- You have robbed me

 Oracle against the people of Judah re: their unfaithfulness to the covenant: they fail to provide tithes and adequate offerings to God; promise of great blessing for the faithful (upon arrival of Day of the Lord)



"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this,' says the LORD Almighty, 'and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it" (Malachi 3:10 NIV).
