Buying a Mac (or Windows) computer **Celebrating Christmas or Easter Celebrating Good Friday Celebrating Lent Celebrating Palm Sunday** Changing to a "Christian" name Chinese New Year giving of hong baos Bad things happen if you insist on your rights in gray matters (8:10-12).

<u>1 Cor. 10:1-4 (NLT)</u>

¹I don't want you to forget, dear brothers and sisters, about our ancestors in the wilderness long ago. All of them were guided by a cloud that moved ahead of them, and all of them walked through the sea on dry ground.²In the cloud and in the sea, all of them were baptized as followers of Moses. ³All of them ate the same spiritual food, ⁴and all of them drank the same spiritual water. For they drank from the spiritual rock that traveled with them, and that rock was Christ.

Avoid idol feasts since they're as demonic as the Lord's Supper is godly (10:14-22).

Main Idea of 1 Cor. 10

Avoid idolatry or God may discipline you for this involvement with demons

God's Authority Structure

The head of every man is Christ, the head of woman is man, and the head of Christ is God (1 Cor. 11:3 NLT) In most societies today, head coverings send the wrong signal—that we are out of touch with societal convention



Don't confuse society into thinking that husbands shouldn't lead their wives (Main Idea of 1 Cor. 11:1-16)



Give up your rights to...

- sue another believer (1 Cor. 6)
- marriage or singleness (1 Cor. 7)
- eat food offered to idols (1 Cor. 8)
- practices hindering your witness (1 Cor. 9)
- join pagan celebrations (1 Cor. 10)
- deny God's authority structure (1 Cor. 11)

Believers with less honored gifts shouldn't feel unneeded (12:15-16).

it would not for that reason cease to be part of the body.

"Up-front" believers, don't arrogantly say, "I don't need you with less honored roles" (12:21)

"The eye cannot say to the hand,

"I don't need you!"



And the head cannot say to the feet,

"I don't need you!"

Main Idea of 1 Cor. 13 Why must we use our gifts with love? Because...

love is superior to gifts, love benefits others, and love outlasts gifts



Tests of a True Prophet (Deut. 18:20, 22) 1. Predictions 100% true 2. Worships the LORD

"But any prophet who falsely claims to speak in my name or who speaks in the name of another god must die...If the prophet speaks in the Lord's name but his prediction does not happen or come true, you will know that the Lord did not give that message. That prophet has spoken without my authority and need not be feared."
