2 Corinthians 7

"Because we have these promises, dear friends, let us cleanse ourselves from everything that can defile our body or spirit. And let us work toward complete holiness because we fear God.² Please open your hearts to us. We have not done wrong to anyone, nor led anyone astray, nor taken advantage of anyone" (2 Cor 7:1-2 NLT).

"I'm not saying this to condemn you. I said before that you are in our hearts, and we live or die together with you. ⁴I have the highest confidence in you, and I take great pride in you. You have greatly encouraged me and made me happy despite all our troubles" (2 Cor 7:3-4 NLT).

Ron Blue on faking...

"You can't fake stewardship. Your checkbook reveals all you really believe about stewardship...your goals, priorities, convictions, relationships, and even the use of your time. A person who has been a Christian even for a short while can fake prayer, Bible study, evangelism, going to church, and so on, but he can't fake what his checkbook reveals" (Ron Blue, Master Your Money, 20)

"Rich" in 2 Corinthians 8-9

 The Macedonians showed "rich generosity" (8:2). The Corinthians are said to be rich through Christ (8:9). God promises that those who fulfill certain conditions "will be made rich in every way" (9:11).

Paul redefines true wealth

The Macedonians gave way beyond what their means could support (8:1-3a)

"¹And now, brothers, we want you to know about the grace that God has given the Macedonian churches. ²Out of the most severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity. ³For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability."

Another example of generosity...

Christ also gave sacrificially by laying aside His rights as God to become human (8:8-9).

I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others. ⁹For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich.

I. <u>Principle</u>: You decide how much you want to get blessed (9:6-7a).



A. God blesses you according to how much you give (9:6).

⁶"Remember this—a farmer who plants only a few seeds will get a small crop. But the one who plants generously will get a generous crop" (NLT).

Rule #1 of Agriculture...

Plant little, harvest little Plant much, harvest much

B. How much you give is a personal decision (9:7a).

⁷ You must each decide in your heart how much to give (NLT).



II. Benefits: Generous giving yields generous returns for you, God, and others (9:7b-15).

Corinth should respond to God's care by submitting to his authority (2 Cor 10–13).

"Now I, Paul, appeal to you with the gentleness and kindness of Christ—though I realize you think I am timid in person and bold only when I write from far away. ²Well, I am begging you now so that when I come I won't have to be bold with those who think we act from human motives" (2 Cor 10:1-2 NLT).

Paul's Sacrifices...

2 Corinthians 11:23-28 I have worked much harder, been in prison more frequently, been flogged more severely, and been exposed to death again and again. ²⁴Five times I received from the Jews the forty lashes minus one. ²⁵Three times I was beaten with rods, once I was stoned, three times I was shipwrecked, I spent a night and a day in the open sea, ²⁶I have been constantly on the move. I have been in danger from rivers, in danger from bandits, in danger from my own

countrymen, in danger from Gentiles; in danger in the city, in danger in the country, in danger at sea; and in danger from false brothers. ²⁷I have labored and toiled and have often gone without sleep; I have known hunger and thirst and have often gone without food; I have been cold and naked. ²⁸Besides everything else, I face daily the pressure of my concern for all the churches.

"This boasting will do no good, but I must go on. I will reluctantly tell about visions and revelations from the Lord. ²I was caught up to the third heaven fourteen years ago. Whether I was in my body or out of my body, I don't know—only God knows. ³Yes, only God knows whether I was in my body or outside my body. But I do know ⁴that I was caught up to paradise and heard things so astounding that they cannot be expressed in words, things no human is allowed to tell" (2 Cor 12:1-4 NLT).
