WRITING THE GREEK ALPHABET

The following large font letters show clearly that Greek letters are written with reference to two lines: the line on which the letters sit and the line indicating the height of "normal" sized letters. Note the following groups:

- 1. Normal sized letters are α , ϵ , ι , κ , ν , o, π , σ , τ , ν , and ω .
- 2. The letters that go slightly <u>below</u> the line are γ , η , μ , ρ , final v, and θ .
- 3. The letters that go slightly <u>above</u> the upper line include δ , θ , and λ .
- 4. Letters that go both <u>below</u> and <u>above</u> the lines are β , ζ , ξ , ϕ , and ψ .
