



Jerusalem crowds wonder how Christ could teach with authority without rabbinic training to prepare for Him to reveal His true nature





"Hour" in John's Gospel

NASB Occurrences (Greek are all hora except 7:6, 8):

- 2:4 "My hour has not yet come"
- 7:6 "My time (Gr. kairos) is not yet here"
- 7:8 "My time (Gr. kairos) has not yet fully come"
- 7:30 "His hour had not yet come"

We must *each* decide who Christ is—and also give that choice to others.

I. Everyone makes his or her own decision about Christ (7:1-13).

Why do people have such divided opinions about Christ?

2. Christ's Explanation

John 7:16-24

Christ tells the Pharisees to submit to his teaching as authoritative as was Moses since the Father (not rabbis) taught Jesus

3. Christ's Person Questioned

John 7:25-27

The crowds disbelieve Jesus is Messiah since the Pharisees do not arrest Him and since they assume he was born in Nazareth

4. Christ's Explanation

John 7:28-30

Christ claims that his origin is heaven (not Nazareth) and God is His Father (not Joseph) so that His identity is the Son of God

5. Response

John 7:31-36

The response to Christ is that while some believe, the leaders commit even more to kill Him for blasphemy, even if He tries to escape




6. Christ's Invitation

III. Jesus' claim to give eternal life always has mixed responses (7:37-52).





"Most scholars seem to agree that the passage is a part of inspired Scripture [e.g., F. F. Bruce]. In fact, the development of the entire chapter can easily be seen to grow out of this striking event in the temple... The transition from John 7:52 to 8:12 would be too abrupt without a transitional section."

"Almost all textual scholars agree that these verses were not part of the original... The style and vocabulary of this passage differ from the rest of the Gospel, and the passage interrupts the sequence from 7:52-8:12. It is probably a part of true oral tradition which was added to later Greek manuscripts by copyists."



Jesus claims to be Messiah and deity, and the Jewish leaders unsuccessful try to kill Him by stoning for blasphemy

"My identity? I am God!" (8:25-30)




HUMILITY

I'm not so arrogant to think I've arrived at the truth about anything, but I'm pretty sure everything *you* say is not only dead wrong, but really, really stupid, too.

Did life originate as an accident?

"There are only two possible explanations as to how life arose: **Spontaneous generation arising to** evolution or a supernatural creative act of God.... There is no other possibility. **Spontaneous generation was** scientifically disproved 120 years ago by Louis Pasteur and others, but that just leaves us with only one other possibility... that life came as an act of supernatural creation by God, but I can't accept that philosophy because I do not want to believe in God. 





Purpose #1 Jesus Healed the Blind Man

Reveal the Truth
9:1-7

Deity of Christ

9:1 Man born blind

We are blind spiritually at birth thus need rebirth which only God can provide

9:2-4a "Rabbi, who sinned....? God might be displayed in Him."

Christ's ability to cure our spiritual blindness shows him to be God

9:4b-5 Day and Night

He was sent by God to work but his work ceased during His crucifixion-resurrection

Deity of Christ

9:6 Mud and saliva

Irenaeus believed the action was to show Christ is the Creator (cf. Gen. 2:7)

9:7 Siloam means "Sent"

Jesus was "Sent" by God

Water symbolized the Holy Spirit so that the blind man was born of water and the Spirit (cf. 3:5)

What is the Truth of Verses 1-7?

Jesus is the Son of God because He was sent by God to give Spiritual Truth to the blind

- "There was the true Light which coming into the world, enlightens every man" (1:9)
- "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God" (3:3)

Steps in the Blind Man's Belief

- Blind man interrogated by neighbors (8-12)
- Blind man and parents interrogated by Pharisees (13-23)
- Blind man interrogated
 by Pharisees again (24-34)

- "The man they call Jesus" (11)
- "He is a prophet" (17)
- "Whether he is a sinner or not, I don't know. One thing I do know. I was blind but now I see!" (25)
 - "If this man were not from God, He could do nothing"(33)



Steps in the Pharisees' Unbelief

"This man is not from God" (17)

"This man is a sinner" (25)

"You are His disciples but we are disciples of Moses" (29)

"You were born entirely in sin, and are you teaching us?" (34)



Contrasts

Blind Man

- Had not seen Jesus before being healed
- Knew little about the Mosaic Law
- Beggar



Received Spiritual Truth (Spiritual Sight)

Pharisees

- Witnessed Jesus' miracles & teaching
- Claimed to know God's Word
- Religious



Rejected Spiritual Truth (Spiritual Blindness)

What Caused the Blindness?

- His parents were afraid of the Jews; for the Jews had already decided that anyone who acknowledged Jesus was the Christ would be put out of the synagogue (22)
- "If we let him go on like this, all men will come and take away both our place and our nation" (John 11:48)

REPUTATION, PRIDE and WEALTH caused their spiritual blindness

Pharisees Lived in Darkness

He came to his own but those who were His own did not receive Him.

John 1:11

For everyone who does evil hates the Light, and does not come to the Light for fear that his deeds will be exposed.

John 3:20

Why Were They Blind?

Pharisees were spiritually blind because they rejected the testimony of the blind man and the Deity of Christ.

OUTCOME

Outcome for the Blind Man (35-38)

■ The blind man could see the kingdom of God because he became born again.

■ The blind beggar become a child of God.

■ The blind man worshiped the Son of God.

Outcome for the Pharisees (39-41)

- The Pharisees would be judged and condemned because they willfully rejected Jesus as the Son of God (39a)
- The Pharisees' ability to see spiritual truth degenerated (39b)

■ The Pharisees continued with their guilt upon them (41b)

John 3:17-18

For God did not send the Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through Him. He who believes in Him is not judged; he who does not believe has been judged already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

John's Message

Jesus is the Truth. Therefore...

 Those who <u>believe</u> in Jesus shall know the truth and the truth will set them <u>free</u>.


 But those who <u>reject</u> Jesus as the Son of God shall be <u>judged</u>.



Application

Let's not follow in the footsteps of the Pharisees--blinded by their pride, reputation and wealth.

Let's follow the example of the blind man--humbly obey and believe His Word.





C. S. Lewis, Mere Christianity, 55-56

"I am here trying to prevent anyone saying the really foolish thing that people often say about Him: 'I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept His claim to be God.' That is the one thing we must not say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic—on a level with the man who says he is a poached egg—or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God: or else a madman or something worse. You can shut Him up for a fool, you can spit at Him and kill Him as a demon; or you can fall at His feet and call Him Lord and God. But let us not come with any patronising nonsense about His being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to."





3. Watchfulness

§ 112 Luke 12:35-41

The delay of the kingdom should motivate the disciples to prepare for His return to establish the kingdom

Luke 12:35-38 NLT

35"Be dressed for service and keep your lamps burning, ³⁶as though you were waiting for your master to return from the wedding feast. Then you will be ready to open the door and let him in the moment he arrives and knocks. ³⁷The servants who are ready and waiting for his return will be rewarded. I tell you the truth, he himself will seat them, put on an apron, and serve them as they sit and eat! ³⁸He may come in the middle of the night or just before dawn. But whenever he comes, he will reward the servants who are ready."



§ 113 Luke 12:42-48

Those who are watchful must also be faithful since it will determine the degrees of both rewards and punishments

5. The Effect of His Coming

§ 114 Luke 12:49-53

At the return of Jesus, a judgment will bring division over the person of Christ, so the people should reject Pharisaism for Jesus

6. The Signs of the Times

§ 115 Luke 12:54-59

People can interpret the weather but not the signs authenticating Jesus, so they must seek reconciliation with the Judge

7. Concerning Repentance

§ 116 Luke 13:1-9

The belief that tragedy only befalls sinners is false, so God will judge that entire generation unless they repent

8. Concerning Israel's Need

§ 117 Luke 13:10-17

Christ heals a crippled woman on the Sabbath to show Israel needs Him as Messiah and to show His blessings if the nation trusts Him

9. Concerning the Kingdom Program

§ 118 Luke 13:18-21

Despite unbelief, Jesus taught the kingdom's small start would grow quietly, pervasively, and irreversibly into a large, new form

N. Conflict at the Feast of Dedication

§ 119 John 10:22-39

Jesus shows that the Jews reject Him as the Messiah of God despite His words and works, not for lack of evidence


