





"The Son of Man... came to minister and to give his life a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45)











Luke 13:22-35

Sheep tend to stray.




















THE STEWARD CANCELLED THE INTEREST

- √His quick planning/action changed his fate






1. Recognize that you are only a "steward" and not the "owner" of all that God puts in your hands (1 Chron. 29:14).




5. Become "shrewd." Act quickly to maximize your treasures in heaven by the way you invest your resources in God's work on earth (Phil. 4:15-17).






No. In Luke she is not named but in the other gospels she is clearly Mary of Bethany




