G. The Report of the Guard

§ 190 Matthew 28:11-15

The guards report the resurrection to the Jewish leaders, who pay them to lie that the disciples stole Christ's body while they slept



H. The Appearance to the Two on the Emmaus Road

Mark 16:12-13; Luke 24:13-32

Jesus appears to two men on the Emmaus Road to reveal that His suffering precedes His glory, but this makes sense only when He disappears at dinner

Could mortals and those in glorified bodies really live together?

Jesus did this on the Emmaus Road (Luke 24)

Remember when Jesus GLOWED?

No, he looked like the rest of us!

Only at dinner did they recognize Jesus

M. The Commission to the Disciples § 196 Matthew 28:16-20; Mark 16:15-18

Christ commissions the apostles to make disciples everywhere with the Spirit's authority and power to be His witnesses

Matthew 28:18-20 NLT

"Jesus came and told his disciples, 'I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. ²⁰Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."



Since Jesus is king, then believers will rule with him!

Parables: Views


Each parable makes only one main point and the details within the parables are not to be allegorized. (Adolf Julicher, 19th Century)
