

- Ephesians
- Colossians
- Philemon
- Philippians



# Why call them "Prison Epistles"?

They refer to Paul's bonds (cf. Acts 28:16):

- Eph. 3:1; 4:1; 6:20
- Col. 4:3, 18
- Philem. 1, 9, 10
- Phil. 1:13-14

#### Who carried these letters?

#### 1. Tychicus

- He carried the Ephesian and Colossian epistles (Eph. 6:21; Col. 4:7)
- He was accompanied by Onesimus (Col. 4:9)

#### 2. Onesimus

- A slave to Philemon from Colossae
- He probably carried the Epistle to Philemon when he returned to his master, though it is not specifically mentioned (Philem. 12)

#### 3. Epaphroditus

• A man from Philippi, he carried the Philippian letter back to his people (Phil. 2:25, 28)

## What was Paul's attitude?

- In Philemon, Paul was hopeful (ἐλπίζω = hope)
   that he would be released (Philemon 22)
- In Philippians, Paul was confident (οἶδα know) that he would be released (Phil. 1:25; 2:24)

## Order & Setting

- Written on 2-3 separate occasions
- Ephesians, Colossians, and Philemon are written around the same time (likely AD 60-61)
- Philippians is written later (probably AD 62)


# Occasion for Prison Epistles

- Paul was imprisoned in Rome and Epaphras was with him
- He first wrote a general circular letter for Gentile churches in Asia Minor (Ephesians)
- Onesimus, a runaway slave, later joined them
- Paul received news of a crisis in the Colossian church (heresy)
- He sent Tychicus with a letter to address the Colossian problems
- He also sent Onesimus with Tychicus with a letter to Philemon

### Some months later (AD 62)...

- Paul was still in prison
- The Philippian church sent Epaphroditus to minister to Paul
- Paul found out from him problems in Philippian church: external opposition (3:17f.) and internal disunity (4:2)
- Epaphroditus became very sick (Phil. 2:26)
- Paul sent him back with a letter to address problems of the Philippians



Critique this picture...

- □ Paul typically had a scribe write (Rom 16:22)
- □ Paul was under house arrest (Acts 28:30-31)
- □ Paul was chained to a guard (Acts 28:16)
- Paul was ≤60 years old (not 80 like this man!)



# Sometimes Christians are Treated Unfairly

- 1. Paul was—and ended up under house arrest in Rome
- 2. Note that a deacon appears with a terrorist & tax cheat

Mandatory penalty means deacon can't be spared jail even though he rented flat to illegal immigrants unwittingly enders were arrested.



Epistle	1st Century Problem	21st Century Problem	Solution (Theme)
<b>Ephesians</b>	Jew-Gentile Conflicts ("Weism")	Chinese Only Baptist Only Adults Only	Realize Christian Unity (4:3)
Philippians	Persecution Prison Death	Ministry Inconvenience - time, sleep - recreation	Imitate Christ's Attitude (2:5)
Colossians	Denying Christ's Deity	New Age Cults	Proclaim His Deity (2:9)
Philemon	Master/Slave ("Meism")	Forgive Boss / Employee / Others	Reconcile the Relationship (vv. 17-18)

"Why me?"	Depression	Melancholy	Philippians


