I. The Time Period (Occasion)

- A. Addressed Christians under stress
- B. 1st generation leadership passing away
- C. Temple gone change in Jewish system
- D. Increasing antagonism between Jewish and Gentile believers (Jewish-Roman War AD 66-73)
- E. Gentile believers become target for political blame (Jewish Christians suspected they had sided with their enemies)
- F. Great texts for preaching to encourage people

II. A Time of Change

A. Leadership changes

- 1. Original leaders were passing away.
- 2. James beheaded, James (brother of Jesus), Peter & Paul killed, John exiled

B. Change from oral to written tradition

- 1. Teachings from Jesus & apostles were becoming published
- 2. Paul's letters were largely finished

C. Expectation of Christ's return

- 1. Some expected Jesus to return at time of Jerusalem's destruction, but nothing happened
- 2. People started to doubt & reinterpret their traditions

D. Reorientation of Jewish system

- 1. Temple gone, so Jews worshipped only in synagogues
- 2. Christians eventually forced out of synagogues

E. Impact of Changes

- 1. Churches became more Gentile in membership
 - a) Separation between Jews & Gentiles grew
 - b) Christians were no longer perceived as a sect of Judaism, which was protected, hence became a political target of Rome

c) Hence increase in persecution

2. Churches became more Gentile in character

- a) Hebrew thinking was slowly replaced by Greek thinking.
- b) By the end of the first century the minority Gentiles had become the vast majority.

F. Faith—the issue of the day!

1.	James:	Faith that works

- 2. 1 Peter: Faith in suffering
- 3. 2 Peter: Knowing the faith
- 4. Hebrews: Faith that is superior
- 5. 1-3 John: Practicing the faith
- 6. Jude: Fighting for the faith
- 7. Revelation: Faith in God's sovereignty & rule
