

#### Covenant

God used Samuel to replace corrupt yet anointed priests with godly leadership in the anointed David to fulfill His covenant promise to provide kings from Abraham's line (cf. Gen. 17:6).

#### Redemption

God's commitment to save the nation from her carnal choice of Saul to God's choice of David shows his concern to carry out his redemptive plan despite man's sin.

#### Messiah

Samuel's willing transfer of his tri-office of prophetpriest-judge to David's kingship pictures the authority of Christ in these various dimensions. 1 Samuel




#### **Title**
