### **Kingdom Statement**

#### **Summary Statement**

The restorations of the temple and people to the land under Zerubbabel and Ezra record God's faithfulness and mercy in fulfilling His promise of restoration to encourage the remnant in true temple worship and covenant obedience.



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#### Covenant

#### Belshazzar's Feast (Daniel 5)

### Fall of Babylon

#### BABYLON FELL (539 BC) Cyrus entered under the water gates



#### **Babylon's Fall (Herodotus)** The History of the Persian Wars 1.191 (430 BC)

"[Cyrus] placed a portion of his army at the point where the river enters the city, and another body at the back of the place where it issues forth, with orders to march into the town by the bed of the stream, as soon as the water became shallow enough: he then himself drew off with the unwarlike portion of his host, and made for the place where Nitocris dug the basin for the river, where he did exactly what she had done formerly: he turned the Euphrates by a canal into the basin, which was then a marsh, on which the river sank to such an extent that the natural bed of the stream became fordable.

"Hereupon the Persians who had been left for the purpose at Babylon by the river-side, entered the stream, which had now sunk so as to reach about midway up a man's thigh, and thus got into the town.

#### **Babylon's Fall (Herodotus)**

"Had the Babylonians been apprised of what Cyrus was about, or had they noticed their danger, they would never have allowed the Persians to enter the city, but would have destroyed them utterly; for they would have made fast all the street-gates which gave upon the river, and mounting upon the walls along both sides of the stream, would so have caught the enemy, as it were, in a trap. But, as it was, the Persians came upon them by surprise and so took the city. Owing to the vast size of the place, the inhabitants of the central parts (as the residents at Babylon declare) long after the outer portions of the town were taken, knew nothing of what had chanced, but as they were engaged in a festival, continued dancing and reveling until they learnt the capture but too certainly. Such, then, were the circumstances of the first taking of Babylon."

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

# Cyrus Conquers Babylon





On 12 Oct 539 BC, after Cyrus' engineers diverted the waters of the Euphrates, the soldiers entered Babylon without fighting.

"It is I who says of Cyrus, 'He is My shepherd! And he will perform all My desire.' And he declares of Jerusalem, 'She will be built,' and of the Temple, 'Your foundation will be laid. Thus says the LORD to Cyrus His anointed, Whom I have taken by the right hand, to subdue nations before him, and to loose the loins of kings; to open doors before him so that gates will not be shut: I will go before you and make the rough places smooth; I will shatter the doors of bronze, and cut through their iron bars. And I will give you the treasures of darkness, and hidden wealth of secret places, in order that you may know that it is I, the LORD, the God of Israel, who calls you by your name." Isaiah 44:28-45:3


# Mashiach (Messiah)

God's "anointed," whether a patriarch (Ps. 105:15), priest (Lev. 4:3, 5, 16), king (1 Sam. 24:6; 2 Sam. 1:14, 16), or prophet (1 Kgs. 19:16) was a person chosen and "set apart" (the act of "anointing" with oil) to do a special work for God. In the case of Cyrus, he was set apart to serve God's purpose in releasing the captive Jews and returning them to Jerusalem to rebuild the Temple, as He had promised: "Then it will be when seventy years are completed I will punish the king of Babylon and that nation,' declares the LORD, 'for their iniquity, and the land of the Chaldeans; and I will make it an everlasting desolation"" (Jeremiah 25:12). God would subdue nations before Cyrus and give him the wealth of those nations in order that Cyrus would come to recognize that Israel's God had done this for him.

#### **Cyrus Prophesied**



"Who has stirred up this king from the east, rightly calling him to God's service? Who gives this man victory over many nations and permits him to trample their kings underfoot? With his sword, he reduces armies to dust. With his bow, he scatters them like chaff before the wind" (Isaiah 41:2 NLT).

"He delivers up nations before him, and subdues kings. He makes them like dust with his sword, as the wind-driven chaff with his bow. He pursues them, passing on in safety, by a way he had not been traversing with his feet." Isaiah 41:2b-3

Cyrus moved from country to country, conquering every king in his path. Around 550 BC he unified the Medes and Persians to defeat the powerful kingdom of Lydia (Asia Minor) in 546 BC. Turning south to Babylon, his army under the command of Darius conquered the city in 539 BC.


The emperor was killed in battle from a wound inflicted from a poisonous arrow during a campaign against the Massagetes of central Asia. Cyrus' body was brought back to Pasargade in Persia, his tomb, which still exists, consists of a single chamber built on a foundation course of six steps.



The body was placed in a golden sarcophagus, and the tomb bore an inscription. He is considered as one of the most respected world leaders to date. He always fought side by side with his soldiers and never left them alone in the battlefield.

#### **Policies of Cyrus the Great**

"I am Cyrus, king of the universe..." "Nabonidus, the king who did not fear me..." "Since the gods of foreign lands made permanent sanctuaries which are now dilapidated, I returned people to their lands and made provisions to rebuild." "Now that I put the crown of kingdom of Persia, Babylon, and the nations of the four directions on the head with the help of god I announce that I will respect the traditions, customs and religions of the nations of my empire and never let any of my governors and subordinates look down on or insult them until I am alive. From now on, till god grants me the kingdom favor, I will impose my monarchy on no nation. Each is free to accept it, and if any one of them rejects it, I never resolve on war to reign. Until I am the king of Persia, Babylon, and the nations of the four directions, I [will] never let anyone oppress any others, and if it occurs, I will take his or her right back and penalize the oppressor."

"And until I am the monarch, I will never let anyone take possession of movable and landed properties of the others by force or without compensation. [While] I am alive, I [will] prevent unpaid, forced labor. Today, I announce that everyone is free to choose a religion. People are free to live in all regions and take up a job provided that they never violate other's rights. No one [can] be penalized for his or her relatives' faults. I prevent slavery and my governors and subordinates are obliged to prohibit exchanging men and women as slaves within their own ruling domains. Such traditions should be exterminated the world over. I implore to god to make me succeed in fulfilling my obligations to the nations of Persia, Babylon, and the ones of the four directions."

"Who has performed and accomplished it, calling forth the generations from the beginning?

'I, the LORD, am the first, and with the last. I am He.'" Isaiah 41:4 The focus is on time. God is the same God to the first generations of man as the very last. He is always God for all time. "So the craftsman encourages the smelter, and he who smooths metal with the hammer encourages him who beats the anvil, saying of the soldering, 'It is good'; And he fastens it with nails, that it should not totter." Isaiah 41:7

In their desperation in wake of Cyrus' advance, the nations made new idols in an attempt to protect them.

### **Cyrus the Great Conquers Babylon**

"In the first year of King Cyrus of Persia [538 BC], the LORD fulfilled the prophecy he had given through Jeremiah [25:11-12]. He stirred the heart of Cyrus to put this proclamation in writing and to send it throughout his kingdom" (Ezra 1:1 NLT).

### Decree of Cyrus



"This is what Cyrus king of Persia says: 'The LORD, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth and he has appointed me to build a temple for him at Jerusalem in Judah. <sup>3</sup>Any of his people among you may go up to Jerusalem in Judah and build the temple of the LORD, the God of Israel, the God who is in Jerusalem, and may their God be with them. <sup>4</sup>And in any locality where survivors may now be living, the people are to provide them with silver and gold, with goods and livestock, and with freewill offerings for the temple of God in Jerusalem' " (Ezra 1:2-4 NLT).




"In Egypt, under Cambyses and especially Darius I, the Persian kings sought to patronize the local cults. For Cambyses the high dignitary Udja-Hor-resenet acted in the role of an Egyptian adviser, and enlisted his interest in the temple of the goddess Neith of Sais. Darius I in turn was served by this same dignitary, sanctioned building work on Egyptian temples, and caused to be built a whole new temple at Hibis in the Great Oasis (Kharga)."

# Title

- Ezra & Nehemiah originally formed one book according to Josephus, Jerome, & the Talmud.
- The Hebrew Bible also has the two books together under the title Ezra Nehemiah.
- However, the repetition of Ezra 2 in Nehemiah 7 may indicate that the two were originally separate works.
- Ezra means "help, succour, assistance" & Nehemiah means "Yahweh comforts".

# Authorship

#### **External Evidence**

The Jewish talmudic tradition has long held that Ezra authored this book.



#### **Internal Evidence**

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- In 7:27–9:15 the author refers to himself in the first person. This is significant since Ezra was not even born during the events of chapters 1–6 (538-516 BC) since he is first introduced in 7:1 (458 BC).
- As in Chronicles, the book has a strong priestly emphasis, and Ezra was in direct descent from Aaron through Eleazer, Phineas, and Zadok (7:1-5).

# Circumstances

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The events of Ezra 7–10 in which Ezra had part occurred in 458-457 BC. Also, Ezra was contemporary of Nehemiah (Neh. 8:1-9; 12:36), who arrived in Jerusalem in 444 BC. A likely date of composition may be between these 2 dates, placing the writing at approximately 450 BC. However, the Book of Ezra itself covers 2 distinct time periods separated by 58 years. Ezra 1–6 relates the story of Zerubbabel (538-516 BC) while Ezra 7–10 is mostly an autobiographical account of Ezra that begins 6 decades later (458-457 BC).

# Circumstances

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Ezra continues the account of the Jewish history Occasion recorded in 2nd Chronicles. The Chronicles record how God was faithful in fulfilling His promise of judgment for Judah's sin; Ezra records how God was faithful to His promise of restoration after 70 years as prophesied by Jeremiah (Jer. 25:11-12; 29:10). Ezra's account of this restoration served to exhort the returnees to follow the LORD wholeheartedly.

# Circumstances

Recipients Ezra's 1st readers comprised Jews who had recently returned to Israel from Persia & the grandchildren & great-grandchildren of those who returned from Babylon a century earlier.

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# **Characteristics**

- A. Ezra records the 1st events following the Babylonian Exile, but only in a selective sense as a 58 year gap separates chapters 1–6 & 7–10. The book of Esther occurs during this gap.
- B. Ezra is one of the few books of Scripture which was originally written in 2 languages. Almost one 4th (67 of 280 verses) is written in Aramaic with the majority in Hebrew. This material (4:8– 6:18; 7:12-26) is Aramaic because it mainly comprises official correspondence for which Aramaic was the standard language of the day.

# **Characteristics**

- C. The restoration to the land under Ezra & Nehemiah related directly to God's purposes for Israel as stated in the promise to Abraham (Gen. 12:1-3).
  - 1) <u>Events</u>: The events of the restoration revolved around the <u>three returns</u> to the land from Babylon.
    - a) The 1st return under Zerubbabel (538 BC) involved about 50,000 Jews who came back to the land to rebuild the temple as a result of Cyrus' decree (cf. Ezra 1–6).
    - b) The 2nd return under Ezra (458 BC) brought back about 5,000 Jews during the reign of Xerxes (Ezra 7–8).
    - c) The 3rd return under Nehemiah (444 BC) to rebuild the Jerusalem walls revolved around Nehemiah himself, as the number of Jews with him are never recorded.

# **Characteristics**

- C. The restoration to the land under Ezra & Nehemiah related directly to God's purposes for Israel as stated in the promise to Abraham (Gen. 12:1-3).
  - 2. Relationship to the Abrahamic Covenant
    - a) God promised Abraham that his descendants would occupy the land from the River of Egypt to the Euphrates (Gen. 15:18), yet Israel in Babylon was living outside of these boundaries. The nation needed to return to the land.
    - b) The <u>Messiah</u> had already been prophesied to be born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2).
    - c) Intermarriage threatened the <u>purity of the Davidic line</u> to fulfill the seed promises originally given to Abraham.

# Argument

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- A. The Book of Ezra concerns the temple as it continues from the end of 2 Chronicles.
- B. Unfortunately, the remnant who returned did not convey as strong a commitment to the covenant & temple as one would expect.
- C. Therefore, Ezra records the restoration of the temple under Zerubbabel (1–6) & the restoration of the people to their covenant obligations under Ezra (7–10) to encourage the remnant in true temple worship and covenant obedience.

The Context: **Opposition to Temple Rebuilding** 536 BC: As soon as the copy of the letter of King Artaxerxes was read to Rehum and Shimshai the secretary and their associates, they went immediately to the Jews in Jerusalem and compelled them by force to stop. Thus the work on the house of God in Jerusalem came to a standstill until the second year of the reign of Darius king of Persia [520 BC].




#### 294 God Approved Divorce under Ezra?

Issue: How could God approve of divorce here when He elsewhere disapproves of it and even says clearly, "I hate divorce" (Mal. 2:16; cf. Matt. 19:8)?

- The text doesn't specifically say that God approved of divorce. One solution could have been for the 113 men to leave the community with their families. However, for the sake of argument, the other reasons below are offered...
- The account serves to illustrate that maintaining the purity of the covenant people of God was more important than even keeping some individual families intact.
- Although 113 men may seem to be a small number, since this included leaders of the people, the intermarriage was certainly going to spread further to all the common people as had happened in the Jewish community in Egypt & the kingdom of Israel to the north.
