Summary Statement

- Ezra & Nehemiah originally formed a single book according to Josephus, Jerome, & the Talmud.
- The Hebrew Bible also has the 2 books together under the title Ezra Nehemiah (עֶזְרָא נְחֵמְיָה *ezra' nehemeyah*).
- However, the repetition of Ezra 2 in Nehemiah 7 may mean that the two were originally separate works.
- Nehemiah means "Yahweh comforts." Once again the names are significant in that Nehemiah functioned as God's comfort through building Jerusalem's protective wall.

External Evidence

- The Book of Nehemiah has long been considered as being named after its author and chief character, Nehemiah himself.

Internal Evidence

- The inspired title of the book reads, "The Words of Nehemiah, Son of Hacaliah" (1:1) & much of the content appears in the 1st person, making it clear that Nehemiah recorded this book.
- Some believe the 3rd person sections (7:6–12:26; 12:44–13:2a) were written by Ezra since Nehemiah was absent for these events as he was in Babylon during this time (13:6).

Circumstances

300

Nehemiah left Persia in the (ca. 445 BC) & returned to the king's service. "Some time later" he came back to Jerusalem but the specific time is not given. ca. 425 BC or even 400 BC is possible for the writing after 425.

This dating of approximately 445 BC is contemporary of Malachi, a common description of post-exilic Judaism.

Recipients

Those who 1st read Nehemiah comprised Jews who had returned from Persia with Ezra 3 or 4 decades before, as well as the grandchildren & great-grandchildren of the returnees with Zerubbabel about 125 years earlier.

Occasion

300

- This story continues from Ezra about 11 years after Ezra's spiritual reforms among the remnant in Jerusalem.
- However, whereas Ezra helped the spiritual establishment of the new community, Nehemiah gave it physical, geographical, and political stability.
- Nehemiah's faith in God saw Him accomplish in 52 days what had not been done in the 93 years since the return under Zerubbabel.
- This account undoubtedly helped his original readers to see that obedient faith can accomplish God's will despite what appears impossible.

Characteristics

301

- A. Although Esther follows Nehemiah in our Christian Bibles, Nehemiah actually is later chronologically. Thus it concludes the account of the historical books of the Christian Old Testament.**
- B. Perhaps no other book of Scripture provides a better depiction of the balance between dependence and discipline, as well as prayer and planning.**
- C. One difficulty in reconciling Nehemiah with Ezra concerns the walls themselves. At the beginning of the account, Nehemiah seems surprised that the walls were broken down. One clue is perhaps that the walls had begun to be rebuilt under Ezra during the reign of Artaxerxes, but the work had stopped.**
- D. Nehemiah is the only biblical book written mostly in the 1st person.**

Argument

301

- **The Book of Nehemiah continues the account of Ezra. As they originally were a single work, they have the same theme: the restoration of God's people in the land. This was written to encourage the remnant in covenant obedience, especially true temple worship.**
- **Nehemiah completes the restoration with the 3rd & final return under Nehemiah to rebuild the walls (chs. 1–7), followed by the restoration of the people (chs. 8–13).**
- **The book also includes some very insightful teaching on leadership principles (chs. 1–7), spiritual principles (chs. 8–10), and moral and social principles (chs. 11–13).**

The restoration to the land under Ezra & Nehemiah related directly to God's purposes for Israel in the promise to Abraham (Gen. 12:1-3).

Relationship to the Abrahamic Covenant

- a) God promised Abraham that his descendants would occupy the land from the River of Egypt to the Euphrates (Gen. 15:18), yet Israel in Babylon was living outside of these boundaries. The nation needed to return to the land.**
- b) The Messiah had already been prophesied to be born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2).**

“Some people just will not work (Neh. 3:5).

Tekoa was a town about eleven miles from Jerusalem, and some of their people traveled to Jerusalem to assist in the work. What a contrast between these people and their nobles! The Tekoites built in *two* places on the wall (vv. 5 and 27), while their nobles refused to bend the neck and work in even *one* place. Were these ‘aristocrats’ so important in their own eyes that they could not perform manual labor? Yet Paul was a tentmaker (Acts 18:3), and Jesus was a carpenter (Mark 6:3).”

- ⦿ ⁵We belong to the same family as those who are wealthy, and our children are just like theirs. Yet **must sell our children into slavery** just to have money to live. We have already sold our daughters, and we are helping others do the same for our fields and vineyards. ⁶When I heard their complaints, **I was very angry.**

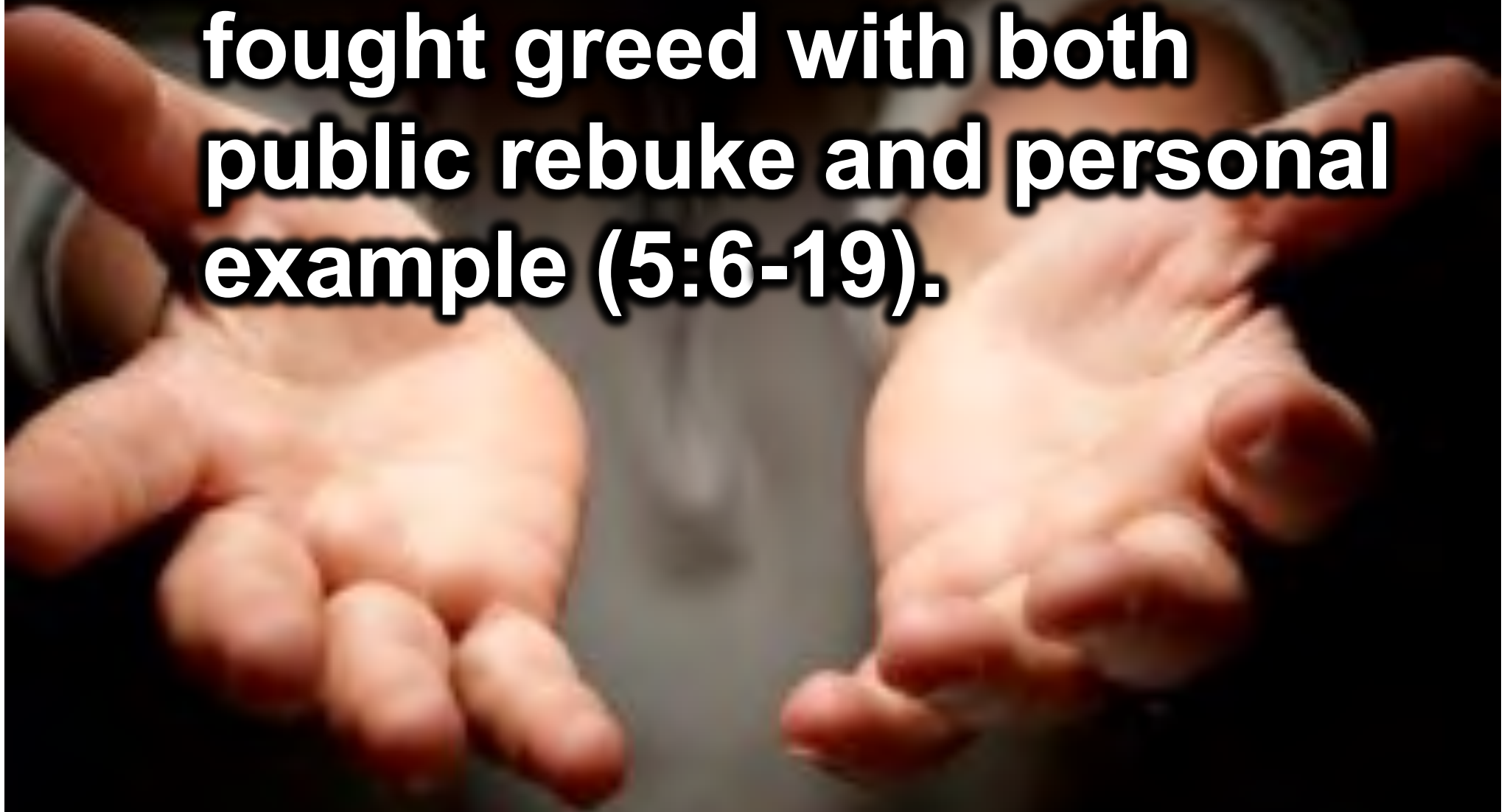




The Hard Numbers

- Nearly half of Asia's 1.27 billion children live in poverty — deprived of **food, safe drinking water, health or shelter**.
- While 600 million children under the age of 18 lack access to one of these basic human needs, more than 350 million are deprived of **two or more** of these needs.
- South Asia has the **highest rates of malnutrition** and the largest numbers of undernourished children in the world!

B. The solution: Nehemiah fought greed with both public rebuke and personal example (5:6-19).

⁷ After thinking it over, I spoke out against these nobles and officials. I told them, **“You are hurting your own relatives by charging interest when they borrow money!”** Then I called a public meeting to deal with the problem.

⁸ At the meeting I said to them, “We are doing all we can to redeem our Jewish relatives who have had to sell themselves to pagan foreigners, but **you are selling them back into slavery again**. How often must we redeem them?” And they had nothing to say in their defense.



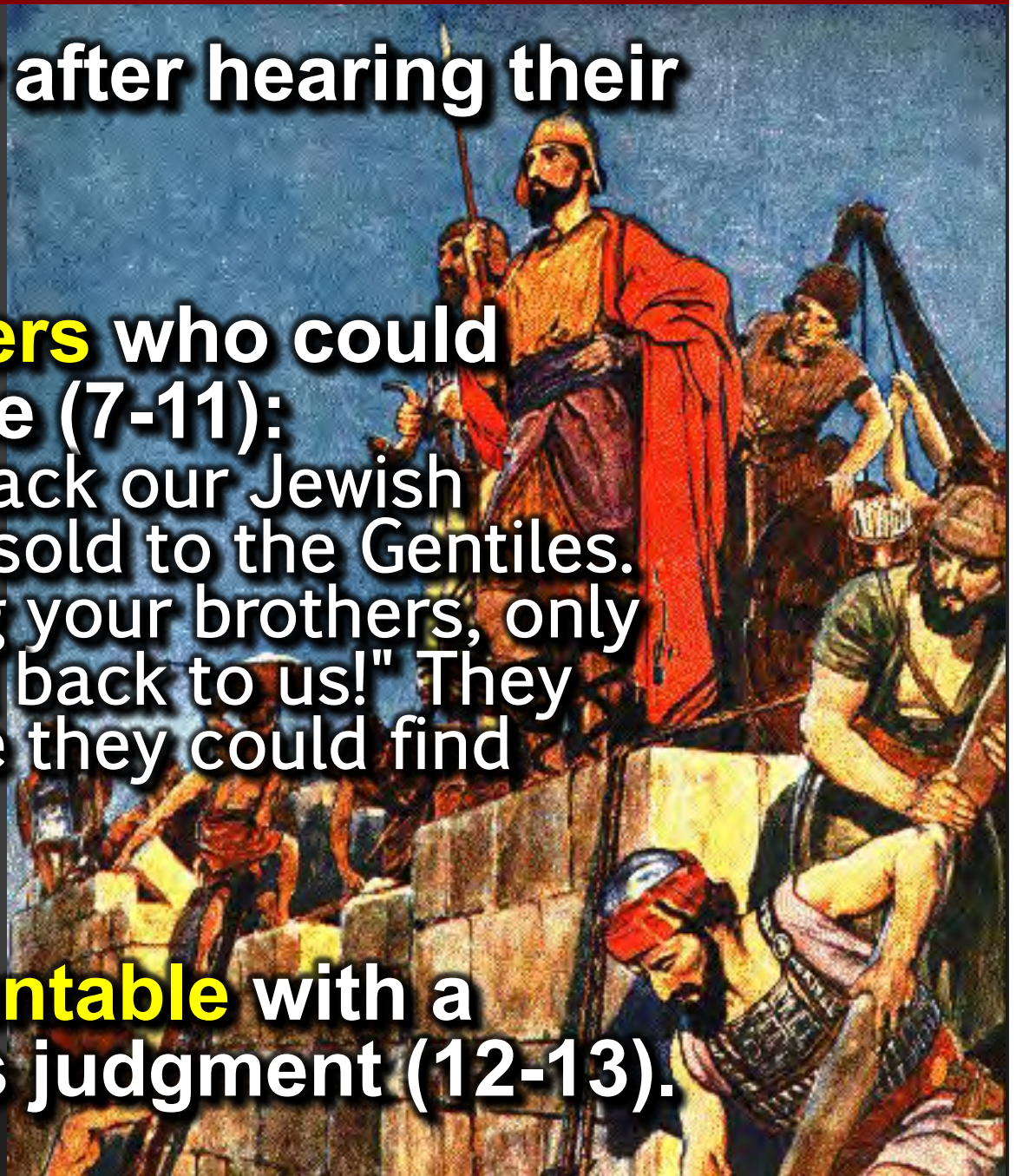
Nehemiah 5:9-11 (NLT)

⁹Then I pressed further, “What you are doing is not right! Should you not **walk in the fear of our God** in order to avoid being mocked by enemy nations? ¹⁰I myself, as well as my brothers and my workers, have been lending the people money and grain, but now let us stop this business of charging interest.

¹¹You must **restore** their fields, vineyards, olive groves, and homes to them this very day. And **repay** the interest you charged when you lent them money, grain, new wine, and olive oil.”

Nehemiah's Response (5:6-13)

- **Righteous anger** after hearing their cries (6)
- **Confronted leaders** who could make a difference (7-11):
⁸We have bought back our Jewish brothers who were sold to the Gentiles. Now you are selling your brothers, only for them to be sold back to us!" They kept quiet, because they could find nothing to say.
- **Held them accountable** with a warning of God's judgment (12-13).



Nehemiah 5:12-13 (NLT SE)

¹² "We will give it back," they said. "And we will not demand anything more from them. We will do as you say." Then I summoned the priests and **made the nobles and officials take an oath** to do what they had promised.

¹³ I also shook out the folds of my robe and said, "In this way may God shake out of his house and possessions every man who does not keep this promise. So may such a man be shaken out and emptied!" At this the whole assembly said, "Amen," and praised the LORD. And the people did as they had promised.

¹⁴For the entire twelve years that I was governor of Judah—from the twentieth year to the thirty-second year of the reign of King Artaxerxes **neither I nor my officials drew on our official food allowance.** ¹⁵The former governors, in contrast, had laid heavy burdens on the people, demanding a daily ration of food and wine, besides forty pieces of silver. Even their assistants took advantage of the people. But because I feared God, I did not act that way.

Nehemiah 5:16 (NLT SE)

¹⁶I also devoted myself to working on the wall and refused to acquire any land. And I required all my servants to spend time working on the wall.



Nehemiah 5:17-18 (NLT SE)

¹⁷I asked for nothing, even though I regularly fed 150 Jewish officials at my table, besides all the visitors from other lands! ¹⁸The provisions I paid for each day included one ox, six choice sheep or goats, and a large number of poultry. And every ten days we needed a large supply of all kinds of wine. **Yet I refused to claim the governor's food allowance because the people already carried a heavy burden.**

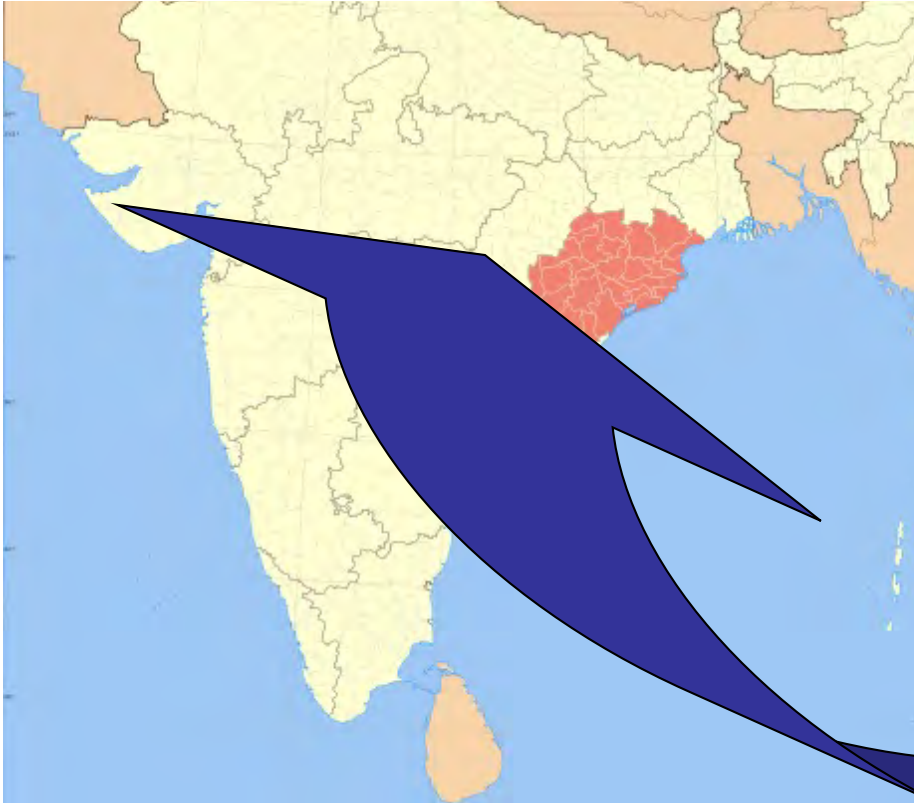


Nehemiah's Example

- **He understood that God cares for the poor and called him (and calls us) to respond with compassion and action.**

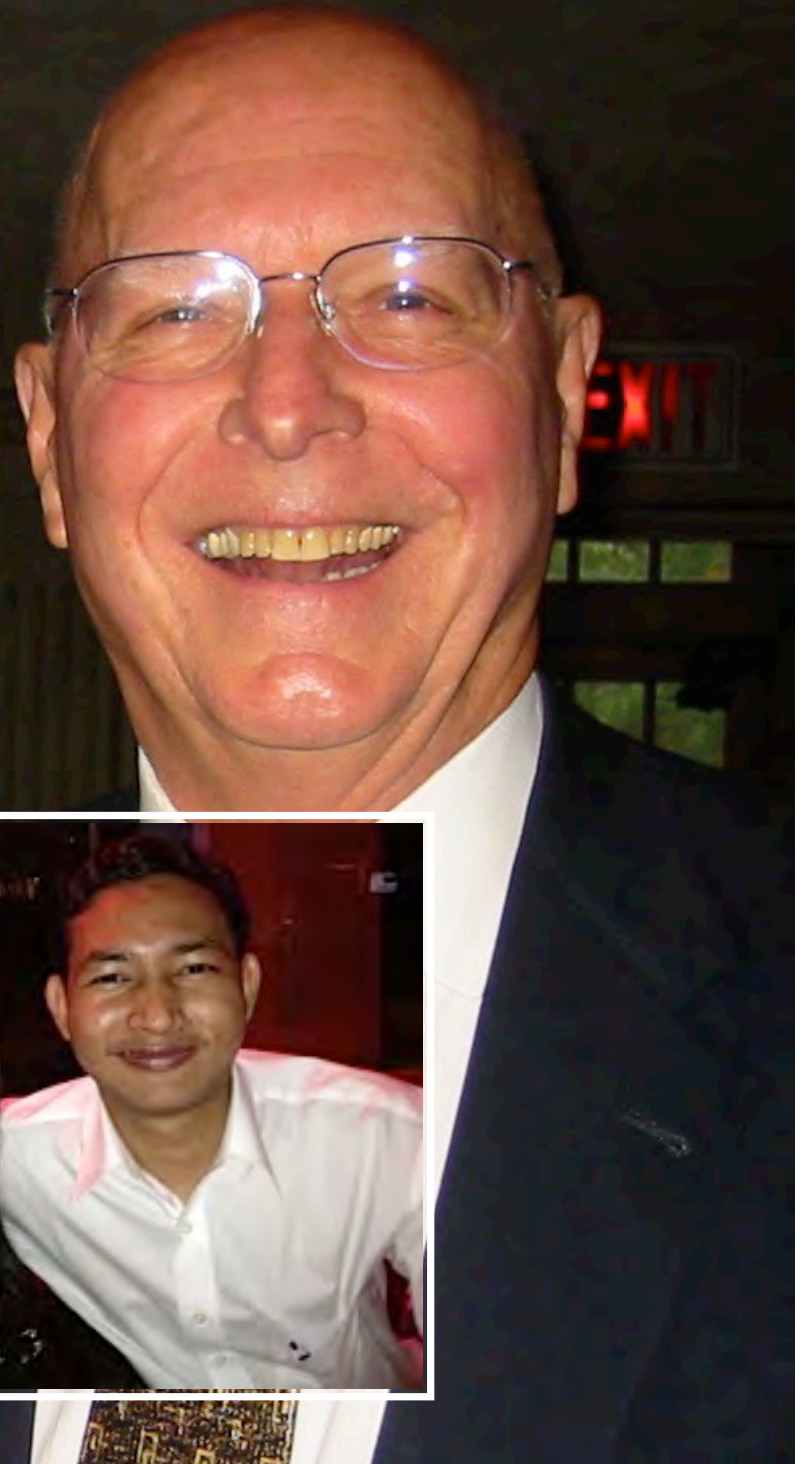


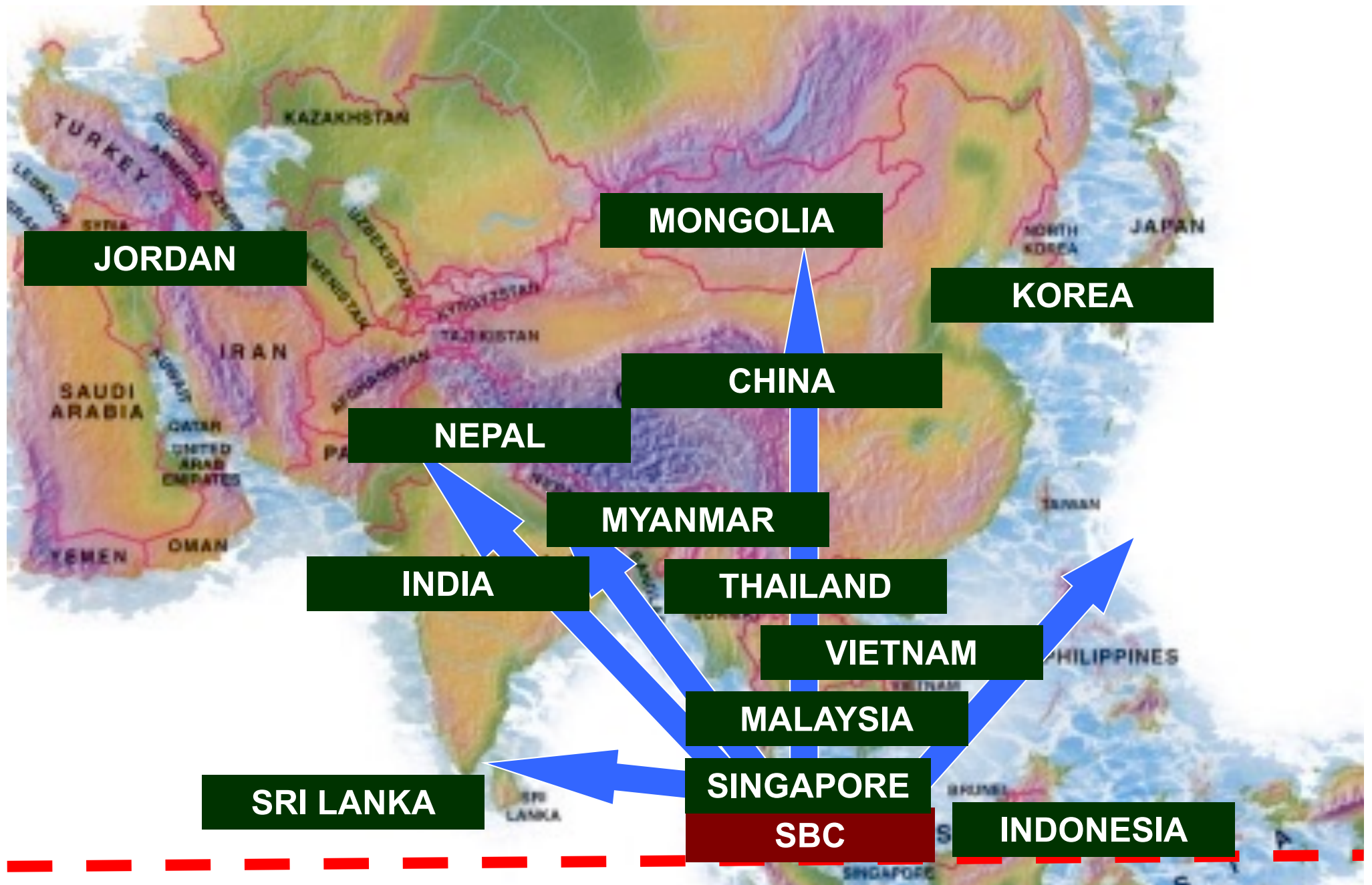

- **Nehemiah saw God use him to achieve the (humanly) impossible.**
- **Even so, the opposition of the enemy still did not cease.**
- **Thus, Nehemiah wisely delegated work to godly leaders and took precautions to guard the work of God's hands**

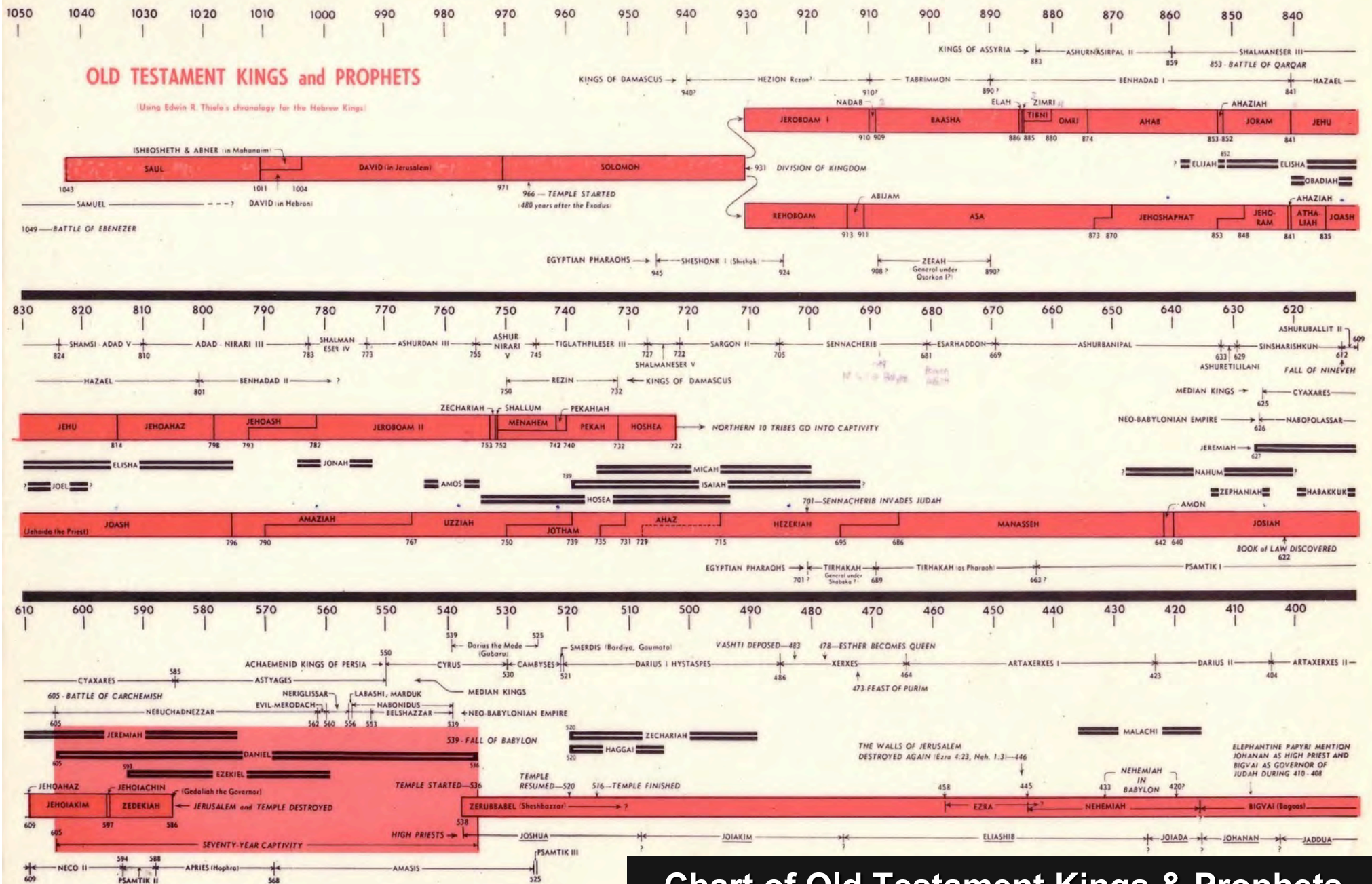
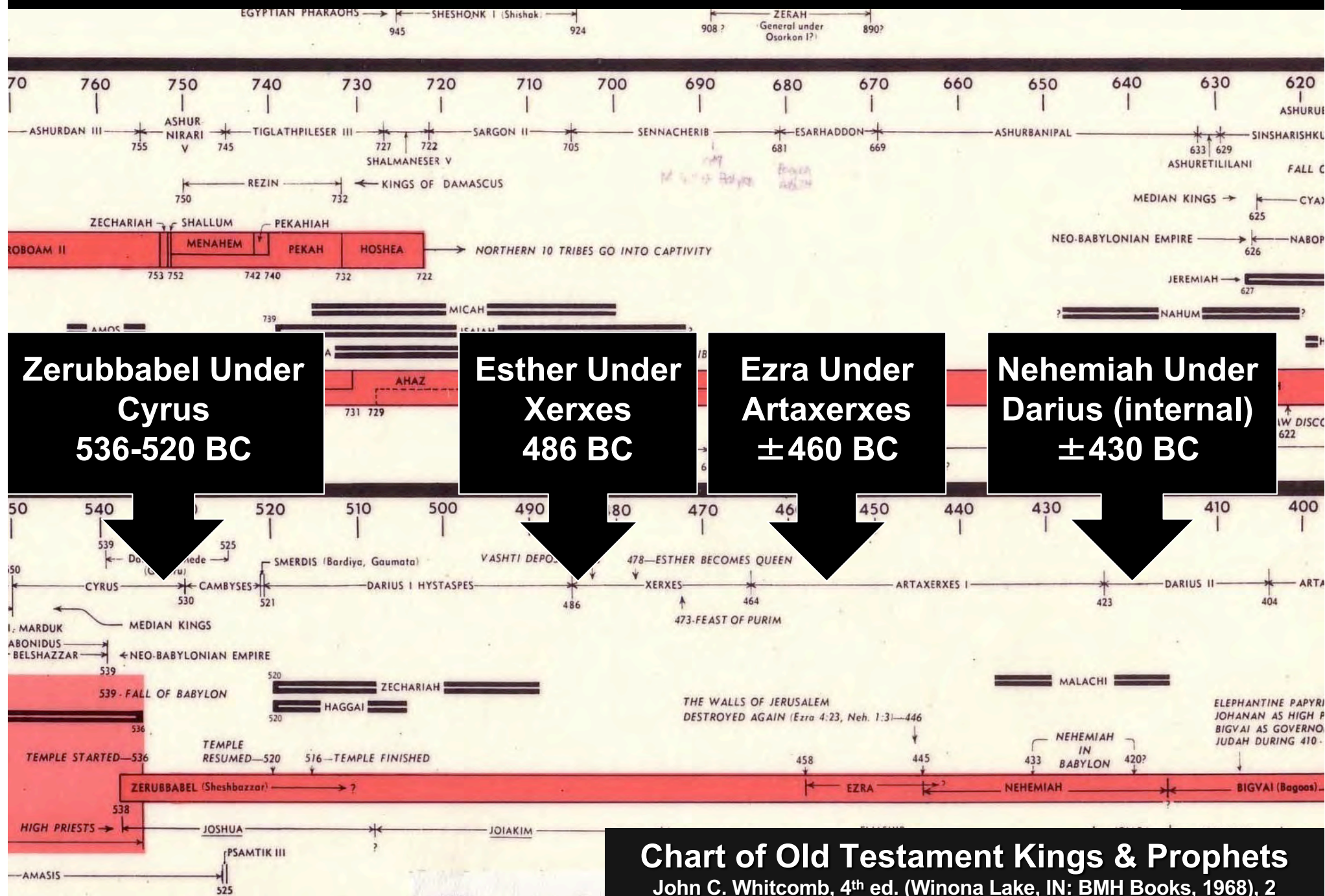


Chart of Old Testament Kings & Prophets
