

After the Jews are judged and believe in the Messianic King (1–39), God will restore the whole created order under the rule of His Son (40–66).









We meet with nothing in the history of the Jews which can be deemed a fulfilment of the prophecy in this chapter; we must conclude it relates principally to future events. It predicts the purity and enlargement of the church. The conversion of souls is here described. They fly to Christ, to the church, to the word and ordinances, as doves to their own home;

thither they fly for refuge and shelter, thither they fly for rest. What a pleasant sight to see poor souls hastening to Christ!



Isaiah 60:9-14. God will be very gracious. We must begin with his promise, thence all mercies take rise. Many shall be brought into the church, even from far countries. Christ is always ready to receive all who come to him; and the gate of mercy is always open, night and day. All that are about the church shall be made serviceable to it. But those who will not be subject to Christ's golden sceptre, to his word and Spirit, who will not be kept in by the laws and rules of his family, shall be broken in pieces by his iron rod. The peculiar advantages of every nation, and of every description of men, shall join to beautify the church of Christ. We must suppose this to be accomplished in the beauties of holiness, and the graces and comforts of the Spirit, with which gospel ordinances are adorned and enriched. 

"O Jerusalem, I have posted watchmen on your walls; they will pray day and night, continually.

Take no rest, all you who pray to the LORD. ⁷Give the LORD no rest until he completes his work, until he makes Jerusalem the pride of the earth" (Isa. 62:6-7 NLT). "The LORD has sworn to Jerusalem by his own strength: 'I will never again hand you over to your enemies. Never again will foreign warriors come and take away your grain and new wine'" (Isa. 62:8 NLT).

"Awake, O sword, against my shepherd, the man who is my partner,' says the LORD of Heaven's Armies. Why Am I Premillennial?

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- The best hermeneutic is a normal, literal, historical, and grammatical reading of a text
- Rev. 19 (Christ's return) is *before* Rev. 20 (Christ's rule)
- Natural way to see the 1000 years (20:1-6)
- OT prophets saw a future period which is neither the present age nor heaven

Isaiah 66

Israel's glorious restoration in the millennium reveals that he will fulfill every promise in the Abrahamic Covenant (Isaiah 60–66).

- 1. God promises Israel a glorious future of prosperity and peace in the kingdom (Isa 60).
- 2. God promises the Servant will prepare Jerusalem for the Father to usher in the millennium (61:1–63:6).
- 3. Israel's remnant prays for forgiveness and restoration, resulting in God's answer with judgment and restoration (63:7–65:25).
 - a. Israel's remnant prays for forgiveness from past rebellion and for future restoration (63:7–64:12).
 b. God gives his reasons for judging the people but also his promise to restore them in the millennium (Isa 65).

4. God promises Israel restoration to the land and descendants in the millennium to fulfill his promises in the Abrahamic Covenant (Isa 66).

This is what the LORD says: "Heaven is my throne, and the earth is my footstool. Where is the house you will build for me? Where will my resting place be?




Isaiah 66:8 (NLT)



The Palestine Post, was an English-language daily newspaper established by lews in Jerusalem in 1932. In 1950, two years after Israel's creation, its name was changed to The Jerusalem Post, which is still published today. The term Palestine at this time was geographic, not nationalistic, and was used commonly by Jews and Arabs alike. At this

time, all inhabitants were known as Palestinians, in the same way people in the United States are called Americans.
