### Theme

### God's Compassion on Gentiles



### **Key Verse**

"[Jonah] prayed to the LORD, "O LORD, is this not what I said when I was still at home? That is why I was so quick to flee to Tarshish. I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity" (4:2).



### **Kingdom Statement**

God is shown as a compassionate King in Jonah's failure to serve as His divine representative to Nineveh (4:10-11), noting Israel's same sin towards all Gentiles.

### **Summary Statement**

Jonah's disobedience and indifference towards Nineveh symbolize these sins in Israel and depict God's sovereignty and compassion for responsive Gentiles to remind Israel of its missionary purpose to the nations.

### Covenant

God's covenant was made to Abraham and the nation that came from him, but God invites all Gentiles who trust in the LORD of Israel to enter with Israel in this covenant (2:8; cf. Gen. 12:3).

### Redemption

Redemption from death exists for sailors by acts of honor (1:13-15), for Jonah by the fish (1:17) and plant (4:6-8) and for Nineveh by repentance (3:10) to show God redeems all who trust Him.

### Messiah

Christ cared for Jew and Gentile alike in his death, burial and resurrection depicted in Jonah's threeday fish ordeal, as Jonah is the only prophet that Jesus compared to himself (Matt. 12:39-41).

And the king of Assyria transported groups of people from Babylon, Cuthah, Avva, Hamath, and Sepharvaim and resettled them in the towns of Samaria, replacing the people of Israel. So the Assyrians took over Samaria and the other towns of srae (2 Kings 17:24).


### Assyrian Developments



Finally, in the ninth year of King Hoshea's reign, Samaria fell, and the people of Israel were exiled to Assyria. They were settled in colonies in Halah, along the banks of the Habor River in Gozan, and among the cities of the Medes (2 Kings 17:6).



**During the reign of Jeroboam II of Israel** Date: (2 Kings 14:25; 758 BC) Setting: **1. Assyria in temporary decline due to** internal dissension 2. Israel's borders expanded tremendously 3. A narrow, nationalistic focus in Israel, which enjoyed its prosperity






<sup>7</sup> Then the crew cast lots to see which of them had offended the gods and caused the terrible storm. When they did this, the lots identified Jonah as the culprit.





### Why not accept Jonah? 601-3

The historicity of Jonah has been denied by many people over three issues:

- 1. Three days in a great fish (1:17)
- 2. All of Nineveh repenting (3:5)
- 3. Nineveh so big it had 120,000 people (4:11)

### But:

- 1. Jonah is noted in 2 Kings 14:25 as a historical figure (prophet)
- 2. Jesus Himself upheld the historicity of the book (Matt. 12:39-41)

Surely this is not the record of actual historical events nor was it ever intended as such. It is a sin against the author to treat as literal prose what he intended as poetry"
