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
### Covenant

Eight covenant visions (1:7–6:8) depict Israel's privileged position and judgment on the nations based on God's promise to Abraham to bless those who bless them and curse those who curse them (cf. Gen. 12:1-3).



#### Redemption

God's salvation of Jews from many countries of exile (8:7, 13) will come through a humble King (9:9) who brings salvation like a Shepherd (9:16) who was pierced (12:10-13).



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### Messiah

Christ is the humble King (9:9) who will die for the nation (12:10-13; 13:7) to bring forgiveness (10:1) and salvation at his second coming (ch. 14).

# Zechariah 1

"In November of the second year of King Darius's reign, the LORD gave this message to the prophet Zechariah son of Berekiah and grandson of Iddo" (Zech 1:1 NLT).



## Meaning זכריה

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## \*'Yahweh has remembered'' (Hebrew)

"I, the LORD, was very angry with your ancestors. <sup>3</sup>Therefore, say to the people, 'This is what the **LORD of Heaven's Armies** says: Return to me, and I will return to you, says the LORD of Heaven's Armies" (Zech 1:2-3 NLT).

"Don't be like your ancestors who would not listen or pay attention when the earlier prophets said to them, 'This is what the LORD of Heaven's Armies says: Turn from your evil ways, and stop all your evil practices'" (Zech 1:4 NLT).



"Where are your ancestors now? They and the prophets are long dead. <sup>6</sup>But everything I said through my servants the prophets happened to your ancestors, just as I said" (Zech 1:5-6a NLT).

"As a result, they repented and said, 'We have received what we deserved from the LORD of Heaven's Armies. He has done what he said he would do" (Zech 1:6b NLT).

#### Vision 1: Red-Horse Rider among the Myrtles (Zech 1:7-17)

"Three months later, on February 15, the LORD sent another message to the prophet Zechariah son of Berekiah and grandson of Iddo.<sup>8</sup>In a vision during the night, I saw a man sitting on a red horse that was standing among some myrtle trees in a small valley. Behind him were riders on red, brown, and white horses. <sup>9</sup>I asked the angel who was talking with me, 'My lord, what do these horses mean?' 'I will show you,' the angel replied" (1:7-9 NLT).

"The rider standing among the myrtle trees then explained, 'They are the ones the LORD has sent out to patrol the earth'" (1:10 NLT). "Then the angel said to me, 'Shout this message for all to hear: "This is what the LORD of Heaven's Armies says: My love for Jerusalem and Mount Zion is passionate and strong. <sup>15</sup>But I am very angry with the other nations that are now enjoying peace and security. I was only a little angry with my people, but the nations inflicted harm on them far beyond my intentions" ' " (1:14-15 NLT).








### The Wall of Fire (Zech. 2:3-5 NLT)

"Then the angel showed me Joshua the high priest standing before the angel of the LORD. The Accuser, Satan, was there at the angel's right hand, making accusations against Joshua. <sup>2</sup>And the LORD said to Satan, 'I, the LORD, reject your accusations, Satan. Yes, the LORD, who has chosen Jerusalem, rebukes you. This man is like a burning stick that has been snatched from the fire'" (Zech 3:1-2 NLT).

"Joshua's clothing was filthy as he stood there before the angel. <sup>4</sup>So the angel said to the others standing there, 'Take off his filthy clothes.' And turning to Joshua he said, 'See, I have taken away your sins, and now I am giving you these fine new clothes'" (Zech 3:3-4 NLT).



"Then I said, 'They should also place a clean turban on his head.' So they put a clean priestly turban on his head and dressed him in new clothes while the angel of the LORD stood by'" (Zech 3:5 NLT).

"Who has ever seen anything as strange as this? Who ever heard of such a thing? Has a nation ever been born in a single day? Has a country ever come forth in a mere moment? But by the time Jerusalem's birth pains begin, her children will be born."



The Palestine Post, was an English-language daily newspaper established by lews in Jerusalem in 1932. In 1950, two years after Israel's creation, its name was changed to The Jerusalem Post, which is still published today. The term Palestine at this time was geographic, not nationalistic, and was used commonly by Jews and Arabs alike. At this

time, all inhabitants were known as Palestinians, in the same way people in the United States are called Americans.

'It appears to be about 30 feet long and 15 feet wide'" (Zech 5:1-2 NLT). "Then he said to me, 'This scroll contains the curse that is going out over the entire land. One side of the scroll says that those who steal will be banished from the land; the other side says that those who swear falsely will be banished from the land" (Zech 5:3 NLT).



"And this is what the LORD of Heaven's Armies says: I am sending this curse into the house of every thief and into the house of everyone who swears falsely using my name. And my curse will remain in that house and completely destroy it—even its timbers and stones" (Zech 5:4 NLT).

He replied, 'It is a basket for measuring grain, and it's filled with the sins of everyone throughout the land.' <sup>7</sup>Then the heavy lead cover was lifted off the basket, and there was a woman sitting inside it" (Zech 5:5-7 NLT).

"The angel said, 'The woman's name is Wickedness,' and he pushed her back into the basket and closed the heavy lid again" (Zech 5:8 NLT). "The angel said, 'The woman's name is Wickedness,' and he pushed her back into the basket and closed the heavy lid again" (Zech 5:8 NLT).



<sup>9</sup> "Then I looked up and saw two women flying toward us, gliding on the wind. 

"The people of Bethel had sent Sharezer and Regemmelech, along with their attendants, to seek the LORD's favor. <sup>3</sup>They were to ask this question of the prophets and the priests at the Temple of the LORD of Heaven's Armies: 'Should we continue to mourn and fast each summer on the anniversary of the Temple's destruction, as we have done for so many years?" (Zech 7:2-3 NLT).


